## Unconditionally Conditional

I'm always truly amazed at the amount of false doctrine and error that the “church” puts out in this day and time. Perhaps nothing else is more responsible for sowing confusion in the spirit realm like the “church”. This is a sad testimony indeed but the Word of God is true and it was indeed foretold by brethren in the New Testament that it would be this way in the last days, **“Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils;” (1Tim. 4:1);** and again, **“But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction. And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be even spoken of.” (2Pet. 2:1-2);** and again, **“For there are certain men crept in unawares, who were before of old ordained to this condemnation, ungodly men, turning the grace of our God into lasciviousness, and denying the only Lord God, and our Lord Jesus Christ.” (Jude 4).** Notice that Paul, Peter, and Jude are all talking about the same thing; namely, that men will creep into the church with doctrines of devils which lead Christians away from the truth and into sin, thus departing from the paths of righteousness which leads to denial of the Lord Jesus Christ in action. Here let it be noted that you can deny Him in action, not just word (Titus 1:16). And notice that MANY shall follow these false teachers. Do you see the word MANY?!? Everyone is always afraid of cults. But the cults, the David Koreshes and Jim Joneses, etc., they don't have MANY followers, as compared to the whole. So where are the MANY? The many are in the organized churches. Yes, the “churches” are full of the MANY that follow the MANY deceivers who are waxing worse and worse deceiving and being deceived (2Tim. 3:13). Everywhere you turn its deception, lies, half truths, twisting of scriptures, yea, mangling of scriptures and sometimes flat out chicanery. I mean, most of the church can't get the simplest most

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elementary doctrines and truth right beyond “Jesus Christ died on the cross, have faith in Him”. In this issue of Unto the End I want to expose a masterful lie that sounds so good and is contrary to the patterns and passages from Old to New Testament. The subject at hand that the organized churches by in large can't get right is of the so called “Unconditional Love” of God. The teaching is that God's love is unconditional; that no matter what, He loves and accepts a Christian regardless of what that Christian does or does not do; that He only see's born again believers through rose colored glasses of Christ Jesus and His shed blood and therefore cannot see sin. What a lie! What a brilliant lie hatched from Satan and the pit of hell and preached to the MANY by the LIARS that inhabit the pulpits of organized churches everywhere. I want to say it clearly and plainly, there IS NO SUCH THING AS THE UNCONDITIONAL LOVE OF GOD. If you believe this you have bought into a lie. You have received a doctrine of devils into your spirit that will only get you, the born again believer to depart from the faith (which also shows that Eternal Security is a real whopper of a fish tale too). But let's stick to the topic of the day. It is my prayer that upon completion of this article you will see that the love of God is UNCONDITIONALLY CONDITIONAL. It's the pattern in the Word of God, it's the plain truth. Let us now turn to our authority, the Holy Bible and see what it has to say on this subject. Amen.

Let's start with the very premise of being born again. Because of Adam and Eve, sin came into the world and all men are born into sinful flesh and blood bodies. As Paul says, there is no good thing in our flesh (Ro. 7:18). He also goes on to say that all have sinned and come short of the glory of God as a result (Ro. 3:23). God cannot allow sin into heaven and He is NOT going to allow sin into heaven (remember this, we will come back to it) and so God had to make a way for man to get clean. This way of salvation was

provided through the shed blood of Jesus Christ on the cross. This newsletter is written for believers, those that have believed so I will stop there with the “plan of salvation”. But Christians all agree on what I have just written that man is sinful and needs a savior. That God is not going to allow sin into heaven and therefore has provided a way for man’s sin to be washed away; through the blood of Jesus Christ. The problem is, from this point the lie begins; namely, that once a person has been born again, been washed in the blood that they are forever a child of God and can do no wrong in God’s sight. God unconditionally loves him or her and sees that believer through the blood of Christ only and thus cannot and will not see sin. So we see Satan has cut a lie into the truth. As we will see, there is no such thing as the unconditional love of God and God does see sin, even on a believer and regardless of born again or not, nothing defiled will be allowed into heaven (Rev. 21:27) therefore it is paramount, even necessary for all men to be born again and all born again believers to obey God, faithful and perfect unto the end for we don’t received the salvation of our souls UNTIL the end of our faith (1Pet. 1:9). The end of your faith happens when you die. Therefore endure unto the end. Amen. Let us now turn to a series of scriptures and as you read each on ask yourself one simple question: can you see the so called “unconditional love of God”? Or do you see conditionality? Amen and Amen.

**“Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.” Jn. 3:3.**

**“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.” Jn. 3:16.**

**“He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.” Mk. 16:16.**

I list these “salvation passages” for a simple reason: they show the CONDITIONALITY of God’s love even before a person is saved! The fact that a person has to be born again to make it heaven is a condition. God loved the world, i.e., in general terms, his love for man was such that He provided a way of salvation but if you read the verses carefully, this love and way are applied to those that received this gift through faith. Those that reject it are under His wrath (Jn. 3:36) and if he/she dies in this state will suffer eternal fire. So right off the bat we see God setting up a CONDITION. Amen. Now let’s turn to other scriptures written to and for believers.

**“If we suffer, we shall also reign with him: if we deny him, he also will deny us:” 2Tim. 2:12.**

Paul, writing to believers here clearly says that if we deny Him, He will deny us. So to avoid denial of Christ, a Christian must not deny Him (remember, you can deny Him in actions too Titus 1:16). This is a CONDITION. What about the “unconditional love” of God? I don’t see it here. Let’s continue.

**“And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.” Gal. 6:9.**

Paul writing to CHRISTIANS says we (the Christian, born again believer) shall reap (eternal life) IF we don’t faint. What if we do faint along the way? We won’t reap. This is CONDITIONALITY. Do you see the “unconditional love” of God here? I don’t.

**“Nay, ye do wrong, and defraud, and that your brethren. Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God.” 1Cor. 6:8-10.**

Paul writing to the born again believers in the Church in Corinth; notice he is rebuking them for defrauding one another and then goes on to list things that if ANY MAN do (born again or not) he will not inherit eternal life. Why? Because God’s love is NOT UNCONDITIONAL. There is condition right here: do these things and you will NOT make it to heaven. Obviously, since Paul is warning Christians in this passage NOT to do these unrighteous things because the unrighteous will NOT inherit the kingdom of heaven, this means that the condition is such that IF a

Christian gets into these sins he or she will NOT make it to heaven. This is the conditionality of God's way. Let's keep going.

**“Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children; And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour. But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks. For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. Eph. 5:1-5.**

Well this sounds familiar. It's real similar to what he told the Corinthian believers in the previous passage. Notice CONDITIONS. IF a Christian does these things, he or she will NOT make it; So much for God's Unconditional love! If unconditional love were true, why would Paul take the time to warn Christians in these passages? Amen. Continuing on let's see what Jesus Himself had to say about conditions:

**“He spake also this parable; A certain man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came and sought fruit thereon, and found none. Then said he unto the dresser of his vineyard, Behold, these three years I come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and find none: cut it down; why cumbereth it the ground? And he answering said unto him, Lord, let it alone this year also, till I shall dig about it, and dung it: And if it bear fruit, well: and if not, then after that though shalt cut it down.” Lk. 13:6-9.**

We see several things in this parable. One, God has an expectation of fruit. We also see God's patience run out (you can receive the grace of God in vain 2Cor. 6:1). We also see God's mercy in allowing a little more time i.e. repentance (He is not willing that any should perish in sin 2Pet. 3:9). But the end result is the fig tree will only remain planted if it bears fruit. If not, it is cut down. The so called unconditional love of God in this instance would have God allow the fig tree to remain planted with our without fruit! But that's not the case here is it?!?! Again, the pattern of CONDITIONALITY is all throughout the bible. For the record, this idea of God's expectation of fruit bearing and lack thereof resulting in being plucked up and burned is also clearly seen in John chapter 15. The Word of God is consistent time and time again.

**“Thou wilt say then, The branches were broken off, that I might be grafted in. Well; because of unbelief they were broken off, and thou standest by faith. Be not highminded, but fear: For if God spared not the natural branches, take heed lest he also spare not thee. Behold therefore the goodness and severity of God: on them which fell, severity; but toward thee, goodness, if thou continue in his goodness: otherwise thou also shalt be cut off.” Ro. 11:19-22 (Emphasis mine).**

Wow! It just couldn't be any clearer here. Paul writing to the gentile Christians in Rome clearly shows that the natural branches (Israel) were broken off due to unbelief and the wild branches (gentiles) were grafted in through faith. The warning then follows that if God spared not the natural branches (Israel) He won't spare the wild branches either if those branches DO NOT CONTINUE IN HIS GOODNESS; So much for the “unconditional love” of God (and eternal security for that matter). If God's love was truly unconditional then Paul would have just said “Hey, you wild olive branch, you've been grafted in and so don't worry about it, no matter what you won't be plucked out!” But that's NOT what he said. He warned them that if the natural branch was ripped out, the wild branch will equally be ripped out if that branch, like the natural does not continue in the goodness of God. God tells a Christian to continue in His love (Jn. 15:9). In fact, staying with this theme of “continuing” let's turn to Colossians:

**“And you, that were sometime alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now hath he reconciled in the body of his flesh through death, to present you holy and unblameable and unproveable in his sight: If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister.” Col. 1:21-23 (Emphasis mine).**

Right here God says He will present us holy and unblameable and unproveable in His sight IF we continue in the

faith, grounded and settled and be NOT moved away from the hope of eternal life. That's condition right there! What if we don't continue in the faith? Then we WON'T be presented holy and unblameable in his sight! Praise the Lord, what truth, what profoundness, what clarity. This is the conditionality of God. Accept it as the truth or stop wasting your time with "church" and just go live ungodly and enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season. God says follow me, love me, continue in my Word and love and commandments. If not, you won't make it! Only the pure in heart shall see Him (Mth. 5:8) and without holiness NO MAN shall see Him (Heb. 12:14). Conditions everywhere!

Please take time to read the letters to the different churches in Revelation (chapters two and three). You will see in these letters that Jesus Christ is both praising and also rebuking the born again believers in each church. At the end of each rebuke He warns them to repent; if there was such a thing as the unconditional love of God, why the rebuke and warning to repent? Would God waste His time telling the Christian to repent, that he or she is not acceptable in His sight and then turn around and say "And if you don't repent, that's ok too, after all dear child, I love and accept you as you are no matter what." Nonsense! Amen.

And we will also take one passage out of the Old Testament to demonstrate that the pattern is consistent throughout:

**"And thou, Solomon my son, know thou the God of thy father, and serve him with a perfect heart and with a willing mind: for the Lord searcheth all hearts, and understandeth all the imaginations of the thoughts: if thou seek him, he will be found of thee; but if thou forsake him, he will cast thee off for ever." 1Chr. 28:9.**

I don't see unconditional love of God here! This is very much in line with the passage we opened with from Timothy that says if you (Christian) deny Him, He will deny you. Praise the Lord. I could list pages of scriptures showing the conditionality of God, of His love, mercy, etc. but I will stop here as this is more than sufficient. Amen.

In summary, there is NO SUCH THING as the "Unconditional Love" of God. God does NOT see you, born again believer through special Jesus Blood Lens glasses and accept you no matter what. On the contrary; God has clearly laid out His expectations for believers (obey Him, walk perfect, be faithful to the truth) and unbelievers (get born again). He has also clearly laid out the reward for doing so to the end (eternal life) and the consequence for failure (eternal death). Why is it all clearly laid out like this? Because God is CONDITIONAL; He is Unconditionally Conditional. Dear Christian, if you have been thinking that because you are born again, God accepts you no matter what; that no matter what you will make it to heaven; that God's love is unconditional, you have bought into and believe a lie. It is a doctrine of devils whose sole aim is to get you to DEPART from the faith (1Tim. 4:1). Please let that false doctrine go. Read His Word. Obey His commands that are opened unto you. Jesus Christ said "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mth. 5:48). All those that die in unrighteousness (born again or not) will be cast into the lake of fire forever. Only those that have not defiled their garments will walk with Him in white (Rev. 3:1-4) and NOT have their name blotted out of the Book of Life. God's love is conditional. God's way is conditional. God's acceptance is conditional. Obey Him it's the only way to heaven. He is coming back soon prepare to meet your God. Thus saith the Lord. Amen and Amen.

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
